

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Why are some DLI developer courses being retired?

A: The DLI curriculum is continuously evolving to keep pace with emerging technologies and industry demands. This catalog refresh ensures that our curriculum remains focused on the skills and technologies shaping the future of AI and accelerated computing, helping developers prepare for where the industry is headed rather than where it has been.

Q: Will my existing certifications or completed courses be affected?

A: Completed courses and certifications are not impacted and will remain on your record. If you have courses in progress that are being retired or open sourced, we suggest you complete the course by December 31.

Q: How can I prepare for a certification exam when some of the recommended courses are being retired?

A: Consult the certification exam study guides for the list of suggested readings which can help prepare for the exam.

Q: When exactly will changes take effect?

A: Here are the key milestones:

June 11, 2026: Website course detail pages updated to identify retired courses

July 7, 2026: Last enrollment date for courses being retired or open-sourced

December 31, 2026: Full access and support for retired/open-sourced courses ends

Q: As a partner, we deliver NVIDIA training to customers. What do I need to do?

A: Training Delivery Partners will receive detailed guidance in July 2026 on any courses in their portfolio that are changing as well as instructions on next steps.

Q: Is Academy infrastructure training impacted?

A: No. The NVIDIA Academy, which offers AI infrastructure training, is not impacted by these changes.

Q: I purchased Learning Credits to train my organization on a specific set of courses. What should I do?

A: Reach out to your NVIDIA contact who will work with you to update your learning plans.

Q: Can I get a refund if a course I purchased is being retired?

A: No. For any courses you have already purchased that we will be retiring, you have until December 31 to complete any lab exercises and access the course materials.

Q: How do I know which courses are being retired?

A: Courses scheduled for retirement will be clearly identified on the website. If you have recently enrolled in a course scheduled for retirement, you will be notified.
